



8.1.4 Procurement, contracting and outsourcing

Procurement of products and services and the contracting for, and outsourcing of, activities can affect existing psychosocial risks and create new risks or new opportunities.



Organizations should establish, implement and maintain a process(es) to control psychosocial risks arising from exposure to hazards related to procurement, contracting and outsourcing.

Determine if acquiring any specific products, services or processes will raise risk levels



How the procurement of products and services creates risks? (e.g. through the presence of visitors in the workplace or the scheduling of the delivery of products and services impacting on the organization's work schedules and workers' workloads, performance and training needs);



Examples might include the presence of visitors in the workplace or the scheduling of the delivery of products and services impacting on the organization's work schedules and workers' workloads, performance and training needs

Purchasing remotely or globally might raise the risk of not being able to control quality...




